Summary

For nearly a half century, 88.5FM WFCR has been inextricably connected with the University of Massachusetts Amherst and the Five College consortium. This mutually beneficial partnership has been at the heart of WFCR's success and is a vital component of the University of Massachusetts Amherst and Amherst, Hampshire, Mount Holyoke, and Smith Colleges, pursuit of the shared goal of creating a more informed public—one challenged and invigorated by a deeper understanding and appreciation of events, ideas, and cultures. This remains at the core of WFCR's work throughout western New England.

This summary of WFCR's activity with the Five College community is designed to purvey a general sense of the depth of that integration and shared vision. By highlighting some of the services provided by WFCR to the Five College community during 2010, we bring into focus the importance of the relationship the station shares with the educational institutions of the area and the positive impact WFCR has on the region.

Historically, the Five College consortium has honored WFCR's editorial independence and integrity just as WFCR continues to be deeply committed to maintaining editorial control over station content. Recognized widely as a national example of high quality broadcasting, WFCR provides a powerful voice for the events, news, and trends at each of the schools.

With the consent of the colleges, the University of Massachusetts Amherst holds the broadcast license for the station as a public trust. Through administrative support services and in-kind support, the University makes an especially important contribution to WFCR's future. In addition, the colleges and Five Colleges, Inc. directly support WFCR's annual revenue.

In turn, WFCR makes a significant contribution to the Five Colleges through each of its important services.

News: WFCR is a primary news resource for members of the Five College community. This is our "beat" and we cover it every day of the year. At the same time, we each respect the boundaries of our involvement. Objective and unbiased reporting relies on preserving the editorial integrity of the newsroom. Through coverage of local and national issues, in-depth analysis, colorful features, and insightful commentary, WFCR's news programs report not only what's happening but also why it's happening and what it means to our Five College audience. This report features all Five College news that was covered as feature length stories, as Spot News pieces (news stories that include audio clips), and newscast pieces (short mentions included in the station's regional news segments).

In-Kind Mentions: Each day throughout the year, the Five College consortium receives five on-air mentions on WFCR. The value of each school's in-kind on-air

mentions (1825 mention per year – 5 times a day – 7 days a week) is about \$47,450 per year. As its license holder, the University receives an acknowledgement, every hour, on the hour, for about \$175,200 of in-kind value.

Internship Opportunities: WFCR enhances the educational thrust of the Five Colleges through an extensive, supervised internship program. In 2010, WFCR continued its paid internship program, employing eight students. Thirteen students total held internships at WFCR – up from twelve in 2009.

This year's Five College Report includes a CD featuring a sample of the news stories produced by Five College interns and aired on WFCR and WNNZ. The report also includes a listing of all stories filed by WFCR interns over the course of the year – they are listed under "NI" (news intern).

This year, WFCR, working with representatives from the career services offices at each of the five colleges, updated its intern recruitment strategy. Already a popular internship opportunity at all of the five colleges, WFCR saw a moderate increase in internship applications based on the changes to the recruitment plan. Changes included: moving the summer deadline to April 15 (an earlier deadline) to allow students to apply for college funding (summer internships are unpaid); providing more information on wfcf.org about funding opportunities for the summer; participating in college courses and programs aimed at providing students information about internship opportunities and expectations of students during internships; and attending intern and career fairs happening on college campuses.

Online Events Calendar: WFCR's online presence reaches hundreds of thousands of individuals throughout the community and the world. Our analysis indicates that many of the visitors to our website are seeking information on Five College events. Through these event listings WFCR leads visitors to the events and the websites of each of the schools.

ISDN Studio Facilities: The station provides technical broadcast assistance to the Five College community including ISDN (digital) connections and recording services for faculty and staff interviews with national radio programs.

Gratis Duplication Services: Personnel from the Five College community are afforded gratis duplications of segments featured on our broadcasts.

Underwriting Opportunities: Each of the five colleges benefits from the on-air impact of underwriting mentions through departmental purchases of underwriting packages on WFCR.

Within each of these areas, there is a significant array of services directly benefiting the schools and the greater western New England region.

Internships

WFCR's internship program, conducted in conjunction with the Five Colleges, offers students the opportunity to gain firsthand experience in the world of public broadcasting. The internship program instills in these students the sense of respect for the mission of public radio that will ensure they remain supporters throughout their lives.

In 2010, WFCR was able to offer 8 paid internships to students of the Five College Consortium and increased the total number of interns to thirteen— up from twelve in 2009.
